CENTRAL MESSAGING ABOUT FRENCH IMMERSION PROGRAM

### RATIONALE

- ✓ French is one of Canada's two official languages
- ✓ French is one of Ontario's two official languages of instruction
- ✓ Knowledge of a second language strengthens first-language skills
- ✓ Ability to speak two or more languages generally enhances reasoning and problem-solving, as well as creative-thinking skills
- Research shows children educated in content subjects (like science and geography) in two languages develop higher reasoning and analytical skills
- ✓ Knowledge of French provides students with an advantage in a number of careers, both in Canada and internationally



## DID YOU KNOW THAT...

IRCC data show that *French-speaking permanent residents outside Quebec* increased substantially from ~4,917 in 2018 to 16,380 in 2022. That's more than a **200% increase** in that group over those years.

According to Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC), 19, 700 French-speaking permanent residents chose to live in Ontario in 2024.

In **2024**, Canada admitted approximately **30,550**French-speaking permanent residents outside Quebec, which corresponded to **7.21%** of all admissions outside Quebec.

As of 2021, Ontario is home to over 652,000 Francophones. Twenty-six regions in Ontario are declared "Francophone," where residents have the right to access services in French.

### WHY CONTINUE IN FRENCH IMMERSION UNTIL GRADE 12?

#### Transferable skills in Finance/Business:

- You might start in a company with a higher pay structure based on having a bilingual status.
- You might be assigned to work with a specific region that uses French to communicate.
- Continued development of FSL beyond
   Grade 12 allows you to learn sector specific
   language which can help with marketability
   within a company or sector.

#### **Transferable skills in the Trades:**

- You might find that work may take you to a region where French is the language most used (i.e., Ice Storm - Eastern Ontario).
- You might find that some of your colleagues may have moved to your region to gain work, speaking French allows for better collaboration
- Continued use of French beyond Grade 12 allows you to communicate with a greater breadth of people and could result in mobility within a company.

# TRANSPORTATION (ELEMENTARY PANEL)

In elementary, transportation eligibility is determined based on where you live. Transportation is not provided to those students attending a program from outside that program's boundary.

Transportation will be provided to:

- FI Grades 1-3 students residing 1.2 km beyond the school and within the FI boundary
- FI Grades 4-8 students who live beyond 1.6 km and within FI boundary. Students are required to walk a short distance to and from centralized bus stops.
- No new siblings on a TCH19, including Kindergarten students, will receive transportation to the FI school.

# **Transportation**

# TRANSPORTATION (SECONDARY PANEL)

In Secondary, the FI program does not have specific boundaries. Transportation is limited to:

- A student who resides within the regular track boundary of the FI school they attend, are eligible for transportation as per the distance parameters identified in parameter 3.1 iii of Board policy 203.
- A student who resides outside the regular track boundary of the FI school they attend, in a
  non-transit served (refer to definition in policy 203) area, are eligible for transportation as per
  the French Immersion Service Area Maps (these maps can be accessed via
  www.ycdsb.ca/frenchimmersion/). In all cases, Non-Transportation Zones apply.
- As per policy 203, **transit served** is defined as a student who: can access public transit to and from school; lives within 1 km of a public transit stop; spends 75 minutes or less travelling to or from school (in a vehicle); and, requires three vehicles or less traveling to or from school.

### FRENCH IMMERSION APPLICATION PROCESS



Application process starts after each school's parent information night for all interested students. This includes students currently in SK at FI schools and siblings of students in FI program must also apply online to indicate interest.



Online applications must be completed and submitted by January 22, 2026 at <a href="https://www.ycdsb.ca/frenchimmersion/">https://www.ycdsb.ca/frenchimmersion/</a> If you are experiencing any difficulty accessing the online application, contact <a href="help.ycdsb.ca">help.ycdsb.ca</a>.
Applicants who apply after this date will be placed on a

waitlist if applicable.



On January 23, 2026, applications received will be prioritized according to (1) siblings of students presently in FI program, (2) students within the school's FI boundary, (3) students outside of the home FI boundary but within York Region, (4) students from outside York Region currently in SK.



If the number of applications exceeds the number of available openings, a public lottery process will be conducted at the FI school, at 5:00 p.m. on January 28, 2026. Approved applicants will be notified by the school between February 4th -11th, 2026

### **REGISTRATION PROCESS**

- Following the application & lottery (if applicable) process, the school will contact you
  when you are eligible to formally register your child.
- 2. Parents must indicate acceptance of placement by completing required forms no later than **February 11, 2026**.
- 3. Students who apply after **January 22, 2026** must call the school directly. Applicants will be placed on the bottom of the lottery waitlist, if one is needed. If lottery is not required and space is available, add them to your list.
- 4. All schools must add their grade 1 FI list to this file under the applicable tab.



## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

#### Why Early French Immersion (EFI)?

Research shows that Early Immersion leads to the highest fluency in French.

2. How does the French Immersion program impact student achievement in other subjects such as mathematics?

Research indicates that the performance of French Immersion students in other subjects is equal to the performance of students in the English program.

# FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

#### 3. How will my child be introduced to the French language?

Teachers will model and communicate in French throughout the day. Students are also encouraged to communicate in French. As the year progresses, students will become more familiar with sounds and words.

#### 4. Will my child's performance in English suffer?

Learning subjects in French does not interfere with English-language development. In fact, it improves it. There is research that indicates that learning a second language has a positive effect on the students' first language skills. French Immersion students match and often exceed the English skills of other students by the junior grades.




### SAMPLE BOUNDARY MAP
