Who was Christ the King?

"Christ the King" is not an Earthly "King" but rather a title given to Jesus Christ, the central figure of our faith. He is often referred to as "Christ the King" to emphasize His role as the ruler and saviour of all humanity. In Christian belief, Jesus is seen as the Son of God, who came to Earth to redeem mankind through His teachings, sacrificial death and resurrection.

The feast day of Christ the King is celebrated on the last Sunday of the liturgical year. It was established by Pope Pius XI in 1925 to remind believers of the sovereignty and authority of Christ over all creation.

Throughout His life, Jesus demonstrated love, compassion and mercy towards all people. He taught about the Kingdom of God and encouraged his followers to seek righteousness and live according to God's will. His death and resurrection are considered the ultimate victory over sin and death.

On the Feast Day of Christ the King, we come together to celebrate Jesus' kingship and reflect on His teachings and the significance of His sacrifice. It is a day to reaffirm Jesus' central role to commit to following His example of love, forgiveness and service to others.

The Feast Day of Christ the King marks the culmination of the liturgical year, leading into Advent, the season of preparation for Christmas. It serves as a powerful reminder of the hope and salvation brought by Jesus, who is the King of Kings and Lord of Lords, reigning over both Heaven and Earth. We use this day to recommit ourselves to living our lives in accordance with the values and teachings of Christ, acknowledging Him as the true ruler of our hearts and our lives.
